Scenic Rim Regional Council Land for Wildlife program is here to support our landholders in the conservation of our native flora and fauna.


What the program offers:

It is a free program for landholders who are interested in restoring and protecting native habitats on their property. Includes but not limited to:

- Initial property assessment;
- Land for Wildlife Officer property visits;
- Technical restoration advice:
- Environmental weed management advice and training;
- Opportunities to participate in workshops with other members;

- Opportunities to apply for environmental grant funding;
- Expert flora, fauna and weed identification assistance;
- Fauna monitoring;
- A pathway to property conservation agreements and Nature Refuge program;
- Targeted species recovery projects;
- Forming a connection and social network;
- Improving mental & physical health;
- Specialist workshops and field days;
- Eligible to apply for Councils Environmental Grant offered annually;
- Access to resources, regular newsletters, LFW sign, including reference books, nest boxes, bush regeneration tools & equipment;

Is my property eligible?

- Have at least 1 hectare of land of native vegetation.
- There must be a willingness to protect and improve all, or part, of your land for nature conservation. Yes, you can also be a farmer.
- Actively conducting bush regeneration on the property.
