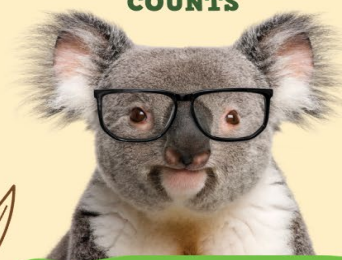



Koala Sighting Form
