BEAUDESERT TOWN CENTRE REVITALISATION: ENGAGING RESIDENTS & TRADERS

Beaudesert's masterplan engagement highlighted four key community priorities which The Gateway Precinct seeks to reinforce:

- Greening with shade trees and boulevards.
- Creating a community hub/destination/library/heart.
- Creating welcoming gateways with improved amenities.
- Walk-able streets and linkages built.



BEAUDESERT MASTERPLAN Community Feedback



Engagement to date:

In September 2016 one hundred local community members of Beaudesert attended a community forum, trader's meeting and / or shop front engagement.

Further opportunity to comment was provided via a survey which was available online through the Scenic Rim Regional Council website.

Summary:

- Over 175 people gave their comments and input across all forums.
- The broad community supports the plan to revitalise the heart and to create a catalyst project.
- Emergency access, retention of car parking and support for traders are concerns to address.
- The concept of greening and making the street pedestrian friendly was well accepted.
- There was broad support to do something in the short term to improve the vibrancy of the centre of town.
- The gateway project was well received.







BEAUDESERT URBAN DESIGN STRATEGY

The Vibrant Towns of The Scenic Rim masterplan for Beaudesert proposed various short-term projects including a Gateway Precinct, new community hubs and revitalised Brisbane Street.

The Beaudesert Town Centre Revitalisation process seeks to build these works in the next few years.

BEAUDESERT TOWN CENTRE REVITALISATION

Brisbane Street

Brisbane Street is the spine of Beaudesert's main street and will be transformed into a green avenue featuring artful street arbours and tall native shade trees.

This shady corridor will link up important retail anchors and civic uses on the main street and it will act as traffic calming to promote pedestrian activity in Beaudesert.

The Gateway Park

The Gateway Park celebrates Beaudesert and The Scenic Rim as places with strong rural hearts. The park will focus on telling local stories and highlighting local culture, both Indigenous and European.

The park will be a meeting place for the town in the centre of the region: a place to celebrate community events and gatherings.

The Meeting Place

A wide and generous stage pavilion allows for performances as well as conferencing, weddings and lunch time seating. The multi-use pavilion reflects the Queensland character of the adjacent old railway station which will expand the facilities and uses available in The Meeting Place.

The history of the railway line is evident in the retained lines which frame a new shady walkway which connects the civic centre to future uses on Selwyn street.

Adjacent to the pedestrian spine, a shaded and water sensitive parking area provides off-street parking for main street and the emerging precinct around The Gateway Park.
