STREET AND HERITAGE CHARACTER

Brisbane Street and Short Street will be improved with new street side gardens and plentiful shade.

The Beaudesert Town Centre Revitalisation sets the scene for a vibrant town centre with a series of green hearts.

The Old Railway Station will be retained and act as a character reference for new structures and works.







THE GATEWAY PARK **CWA HUB**

The CWA building will be relocated to form a social activity hub at the Northern end of The Gateway Park and will activate the extension of Selwyn Street. An illuminated and shaded avenue will link the CWA back to The Civic Precinct and new car park.

GATEWAY PARK PLANTING DESIGN APPROACH

Plantings will feature Indigenous species common to the Beaudesert district and adjusted to climate change.

Beaudesert's agricultural heritage will be featured with a range of hardy productive plants and shrubs intermixed into gardens.

Drought hardiness and low maintenance will be key criteria for plants. Gardens will aim to create multi-tiered areas which provide places for biodiversity and refuge. Plants which promote birdlife and butterflies will also feature.

The park will feature spectacular and robust trees and plants that are common in Beaudesert and its natural forest areas. Street trees will also feature climate adaptive species which will survive hot summers, drought and provide deep shade.



NEXT STEPS: ONGOING DESIGN & CONSULTATION

The ongoing consultation process will feature:

- A town hall evening where residents and traders can discuss the developed ulletprecinct plans.
- A breakfast meeting where busy traders can be invited to discuss ulletand comment on plans.
- A one-day shopfront in the art gallery foyer, where consultants can explain ulletin one to one detail the precinct plans.



- A morning workshop with local artists, crafts people and fabricators to develop ideas and create a local pool of skills to draw from.
- A web-based engagement, where plans and visualisations can be commented on by residents.
- A meeting with local elders and Indigenous member residents to discuss stories, needs and visions.

The community engagement will help further shape the stories and themes to celebrate in The Beaudesert Town Centre Revitalisation.
