

Geotechnical Investigation - Philp Mountain Road

October 2022

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Following damage to Philp Mountain Road caused by the heavy rain events in March 2021, Council has scheduled further geotechnical investigations to better understand existing ground conditions. The works include drilling boreholes in the roadway to gather additional information which will be used to determine the best options for fixing the current damage.

This project is jointly funded by the Australian Government and Queensland Government under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.

WHEN WILL IT HAPPEN?

The Geotechnical investigations are expected to commence onsite in early October and expected to take one (1) full working day, weather conditions permitting. Works will generally occur between 8:00am to 4:00pm.

WHERE WILL IT HAPPEN?

Geotechnical investigations will be carried out along Philp Mountain Road parallel to Camp Creek Retreat, Running Creek.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT?

Geotechnical investigation plant, equipment and personnel will be active in the area during the works, with noise and vibration to be experienced during this time at the site.

Philip Mountain Road will be closed under traffic control during these works. Motorists and pedestrians are requested to observe traffic advisory signage and directions from onsite traffic controllers.

Every effort will be made to minimise the impact on the travelling public.

Council acknowledges there may be a level of inconvenience to local residents, pedestrians, and motorists while these works are being undertaken. Your patience and understanding are appreciated.
