

# Black Spot - road safety upgrade works

November 2022

## Birnam Street, Beaudesert

As part of Council's ongoing commitment to delivering an accessible and serviced region, Council will undertake road safety upgrade works at two intersections on Birnam Street at James Street and Alice Street in Beaudesert.

Works for the James Street intersection include the installation of traffic calming devices, including concrete islands, line marking, signage and new asphalt will be placed through the intersection.

Works for the Alice Street intersection include the installation of a single lane roundabout, new kerb, asphalt and the installation of a raised priority pedestrian crossing on the western side of the intersection.

### WHEN WILL IT HAPPEN?

Works are scheduled during January 2023 to May 2023, weather and construction conditions permitting. Works will generally be carried out between 6.30am to 6.00pm Monday to Saturday.

### WHERE WILL IT HAPPEN?

Works will take place along Birnam Street at the intersections with James and Alice streets.

### WHAT CAN I EXPECT?

Temporary traffic management and partial closures may be required and detours will be sign posted. Access will be maintained to all properties. Construction plant will be active in the area during project construction, and there will be noise and vibration at the sites. Every effort has been made to keep disruption to a minimum to reduce the impact on the travelling public.

Your patience and understanding are appreciated as Council delivers this improvement to the road network.
