OVERVIEW

The Council's Waste Management and Resource Recovery Strategy 2021-2026 was endorsed in June 2021.

The Strategy is actioned through six connected programs supporting the overall vision of the Queensland Waste Management and Resource Recovery Strategy 2019:

- Reducing the impact of waste on the environment
- Transitioning to a circular economy for waste
- Building economic opportunity

ACTIONS IDENTIFIED FOR IMPLEMENTATION WITHIN YEAR TWO OF THE STRATEGY ARE HIGHLIGHTED IN GREEN BELOW.

Strategic developments for longterm benefits has been the focus for FY 2022-23. The key milestones achieved as part of this progress include, development of the Expression of Interest for waste assets and operations, development of Waste Facility Diversion and Reduction plan, development of Disaster Waste Management Plan and Waste Services Resilience Roadmap.

These strategic documents set specific priority outcomes and outline deliverables for the next 2-3 years.

This Report Card details the region's current waste generation and diversion to ensure we are keeping focus on the overall vision. Given the changes that will be needed in both the services Council provide and the individual decisions we make, it will take time for waste generation to trend down and for waste diversion to increase.






