

# Guanaba Road, Tamborine Mountain

February 2026

## Geotechnical Remediation

As part of Council's ongoing commitment to maintaining a safe and accessible region, geotechnical remediation works will be undertaken to stabilise the fire trail located behind Guanaba Road. These works are designed to retain the embankment and reduce the risk of future landslips.

The project is jointly funded under the Australian and Queensland governments Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements in partnership with Scenic Rim Regional Council.

The improvements will enhance land stability and increase the resilience of the fire trail infrastructure during significant rainfall events. Works will include minor earthworks, piling activities and construction of a retaining wall.

### When will it happen?

Works are set to commence early February 2026 and conclude by the end of May 2026, weather and construction conditions permitting. Planned hours of work are between 6:00am and 6:00pm, Monday to Friday, and may include Saturday works if required.

A further update closer to the expected commencement time may occur, if any changes.

### Where will it happen?

Works will occur adjacent to Guanaba Road within the Council parklands behind properties along Guanaba Road.

### What can I expect?

The current fire trail located from Guanaba Road will be closed off to the public during construction and temporary traffic management will be in place on Guanaba Road, to assist with safe construction vehicle movements.


There may be construction noise and vehicle travelling along the connecting roads from Guanaba Road. Construction noise will be restricted to Council approved hours.
