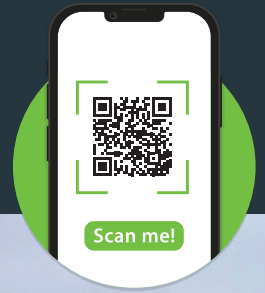


# TAMBORINE MOUNTAIN GALLERY WALK PRECINCT

Project Update April 2026

**Scenic Rim Regional Council thanks members of the community for their patience while construction continues on the Tamborine Mountain Gallery Walk Precinct upgrade.**

This project will deliver a new off-street car park and safety improvements to help ease congestion along Gallery Walk and make it safer and easier for residents and visitors to move around the precinct.

This project is jointly funded by the Queensland Government's South East Queensland Community Stimulus Program and Scenic Rim Regional Council.

When complete, **Stage One** will include:

- 94 standard car parks
- five accessible parking bays
- three coach parking bays
- minor upgrades to existing public amenities additional seating areas
- landscaping and signage improvements
- a raised pedestrian crossing, improved lighting and shared pathways to enhance pedestrian safety.

These improvements aim to support local businesses, improve safety and create a more welcoming and accessible precinct for everyone.

## RECENT PROGRESS ON SITE

Over the past few months, the project team has completed several important construction activities including:

- continued work on the Bio Basin
- preparation works for the new footpaths which are 70 per cent complete

Crews have begun to remove plant and equipment that is no longer required on site.

## WHAT IS HAPPENING NEXT

Over coming weeks, the project team plans to:

- finalise footpath preparation
- complete remaining topsoil works.

Construction equipment such as excavators, trucks, and rollers will be operating on site, which may result in noise and vibration during the works.

Materials will continue to be delivered via Long Road, Tamborine Mountain, under strict traffic management and with appropriate road signage to ensure safety.

## SAFETY AND LIGHTING UPDATE

Council has heard community questions about fencing, lighting and safety around the new car park.

To improve safety for car park users and neighbouring properties, a 1.8-metre timber fence will be installed along the eastern, northern and southern boundaries once Stage One is complete.

The lighting design has been revised to meet recently updated standards.

The new lighting will provide safe visibility for people using the car park and pathways while reducing brightness and the number of light poles required.
