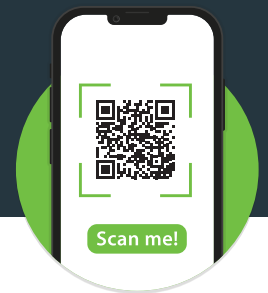


TAMBORINE MOUNTAIN GALLERY WALK PRECINCT

Project Update July - August 2026



Scenic Rim Regional Council would like to thank the community for your patience and understanding as these important works progress. We also encourage everyone to continue supporting local businesses during this time.

This project is jointly funded by the Queensland Government's South East Queensland Community Stimulus Program and Scenic Rim Regional Council.

This phase of Stage One of the project aims to support local businesses, improve safety and create a more welcoming and accessible precinct for everyone.

The next step for **Stage One** will include:

- 100m of upgrades to Long Road, including entry and exit to new car park
- minor upgrades to existing public amenities
- landscaping and signage improvements
- 1.8m fencing around the car park boundary
- installation of car park lighting
- a raised pedestrian crossing, along with improved lighting and shared pathways to enhance pedestrian safety.

BENEFITS OF A RAISED PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

By elevating the crossing to footpath level, it improves visibility for both pedestrians and motorists, encourages safer travel speeds, and creates a more accessible, user-friendly connection across the road. Raised pedestrian crossings support safer movement for all users, particularly in busy precincts.

WHAT IS HAPPENING NEXT

Over the coming weeks, the project team will be carrying out activities along Long Road.

These include:

- demolition of existing concrete paths;
- installation of new stormwater infrastructure; and
- installation of new electrical infrastructure.

Construction equipment such as excavators, trucks, and rollers will be operating on site, which may result in noise and vibration during the works.

PLEASE BE SAFE

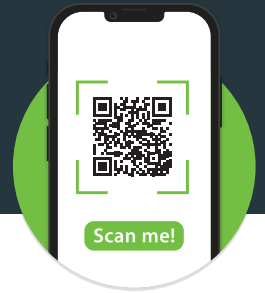
TRAFFIC
