



Common Market Stalls

Drinks Only

A licence is not required to sell drinks (including tea and coffee) unless the business operator is creating the fruit/vegetable juice themselves (ie cutting up and blending fruit or vegetables) either at the stall or at home.

Produce

A licence is not required for the sale of whole fruit and vegetables, but a licence is required once produce has been cut.

If the produce is cut prior to entering the market, it the premises where it was processed should be licensed.

Jams / Chutneys / Relishes

A licence is not required for the sale of pre-packaged products, however the product must be legally made in a licensed kitchen under the Food Act 2006. A licence certificate is granted by local councils and you may request a copy before operation of a stall by a customer.

Further, Queensland Health requires that nutritional information and ingredient listings are on every product. If this information isn't available, the product should be removed from sale.

Ice cream van / vendors

The sale of ice-cream requires a licence.

Snack Food (cakes, biscuits, slices etc)

The sale of snack food does not require a licence, however the product must be legally made in a licensed kitchen under the Food Act 2006. A licence certificate is granted by local councils and you may request a copy before operation of a stall by a customer.

Further, Queensland Health requires that nutritional information and ingredient listings are on every product. If this information isn't available, the product should be removed from sale.

Sale of Herbs, Seeds And Spices (including tea & coffee beans)

The sale of herbs seeds and spices does not require a licence, however if the product is re-packed and handled by a business, they may require a license under the *Food Act 2006*.

Cooked and Prepared Meals, BBQs & Sausage Sizzles

Cooked and prepared food on site requires a licence

NOTE: Some Businesses may not require a licence to **sell** food at the markets, however the licence will be on the premises where the food is manufactured or made, e.g. at home or commercial kitchen.

Although these home manufacturers are not required to display their licence at the stall, if you wish to verify the eligibility of where the food is created, you may request to see a copy of their certificate before you issue them a stall location. Further note, that their licence may not be issued by Scenic Rim Regional Council, but another local government.
