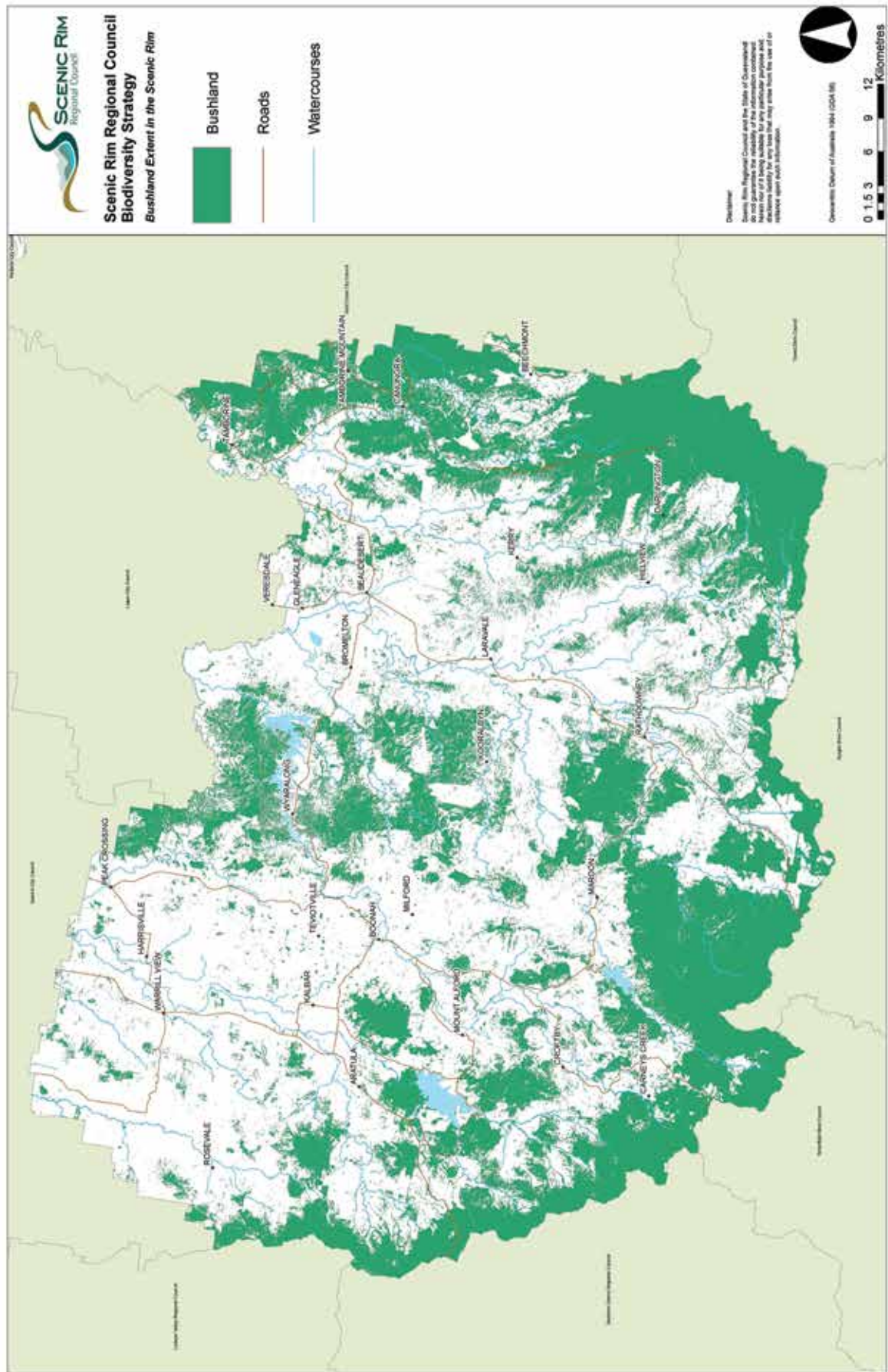




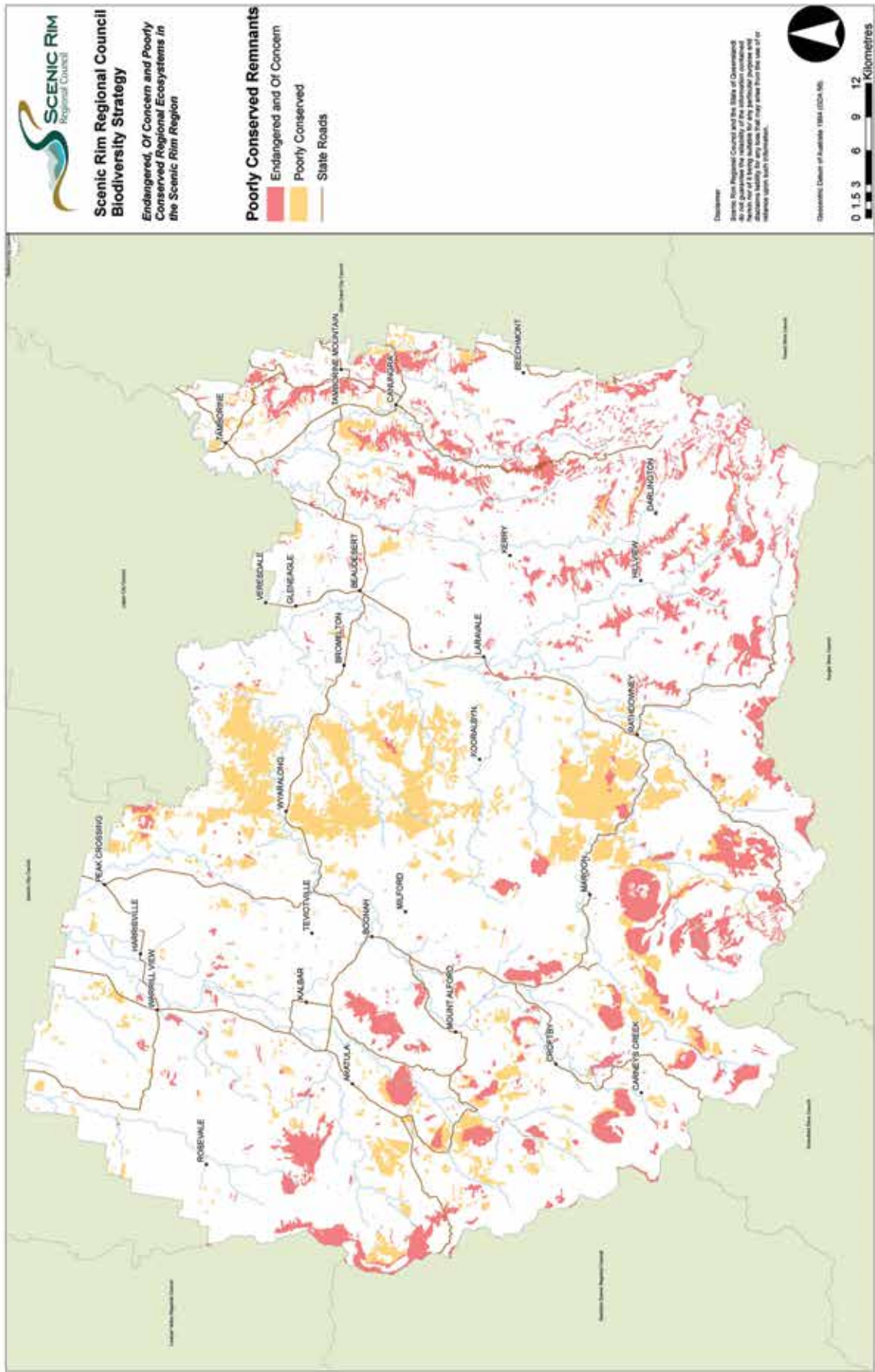

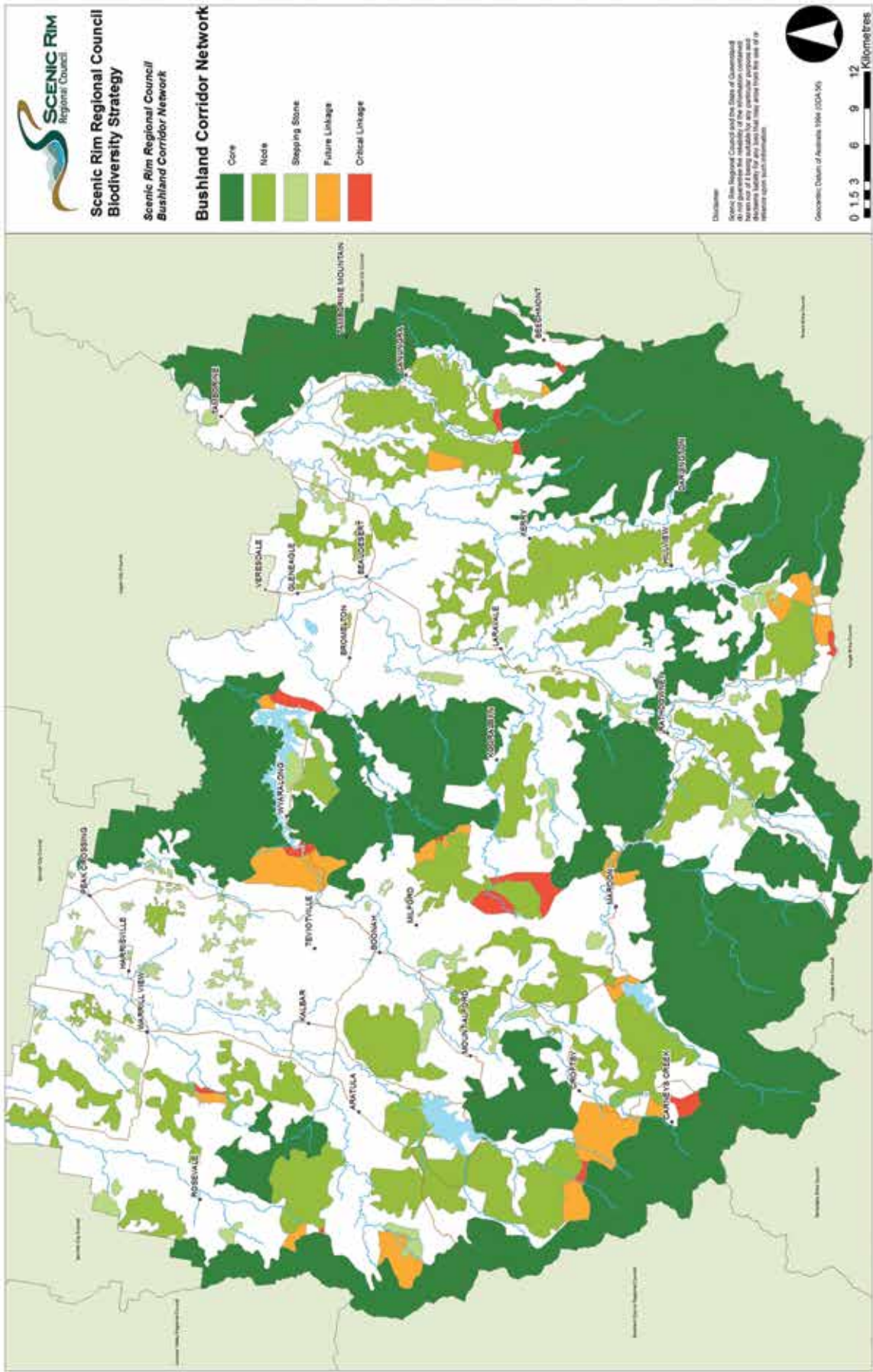
MAP 1: BUSHLAND EXTENT IN SCENIC RIM



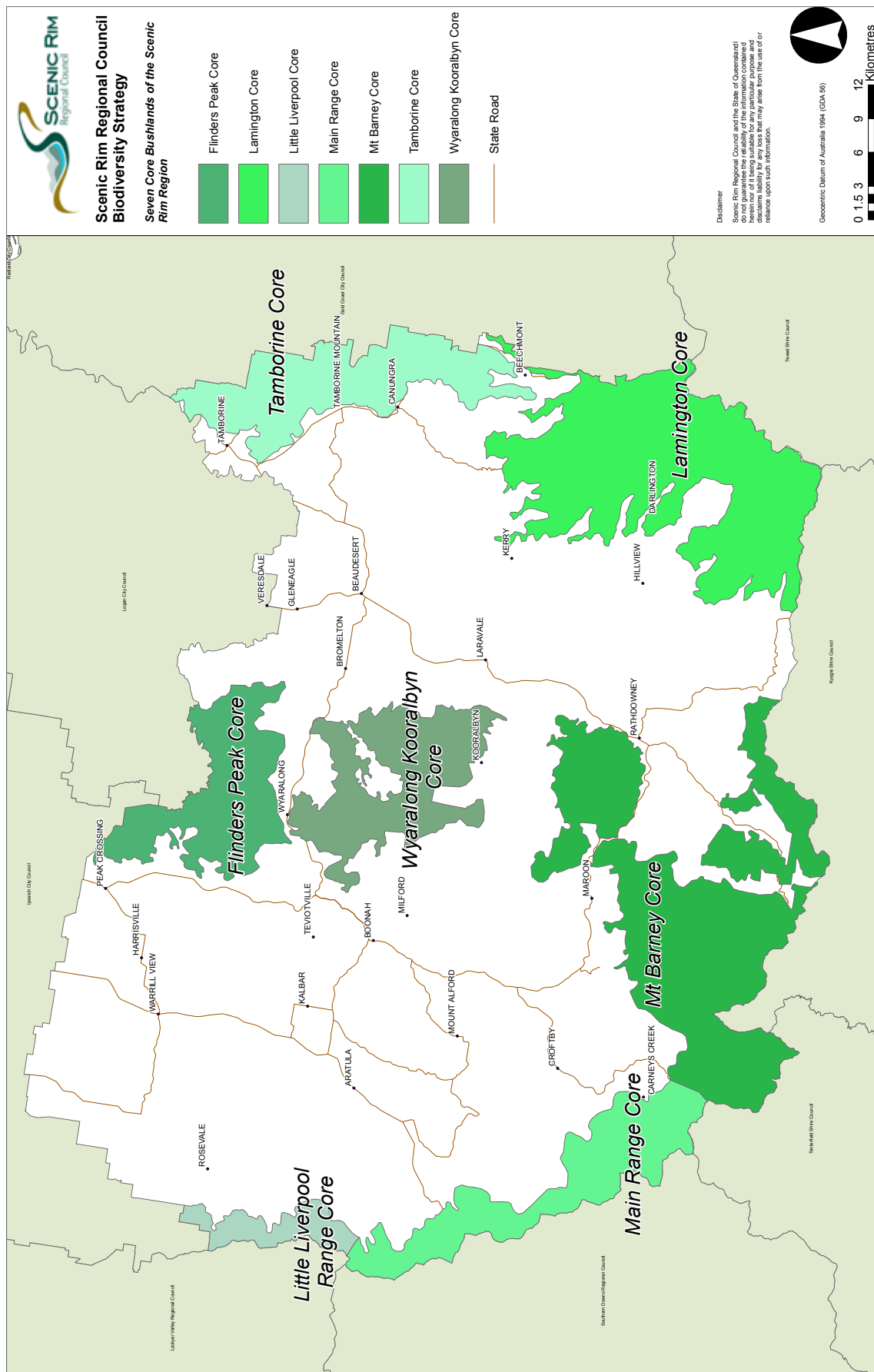
MAP 2: ENDANGERED, OF CONCERN AND POORLY CONSERVED REGIONAL ECOSYSTEMS IN SCENIC RIM

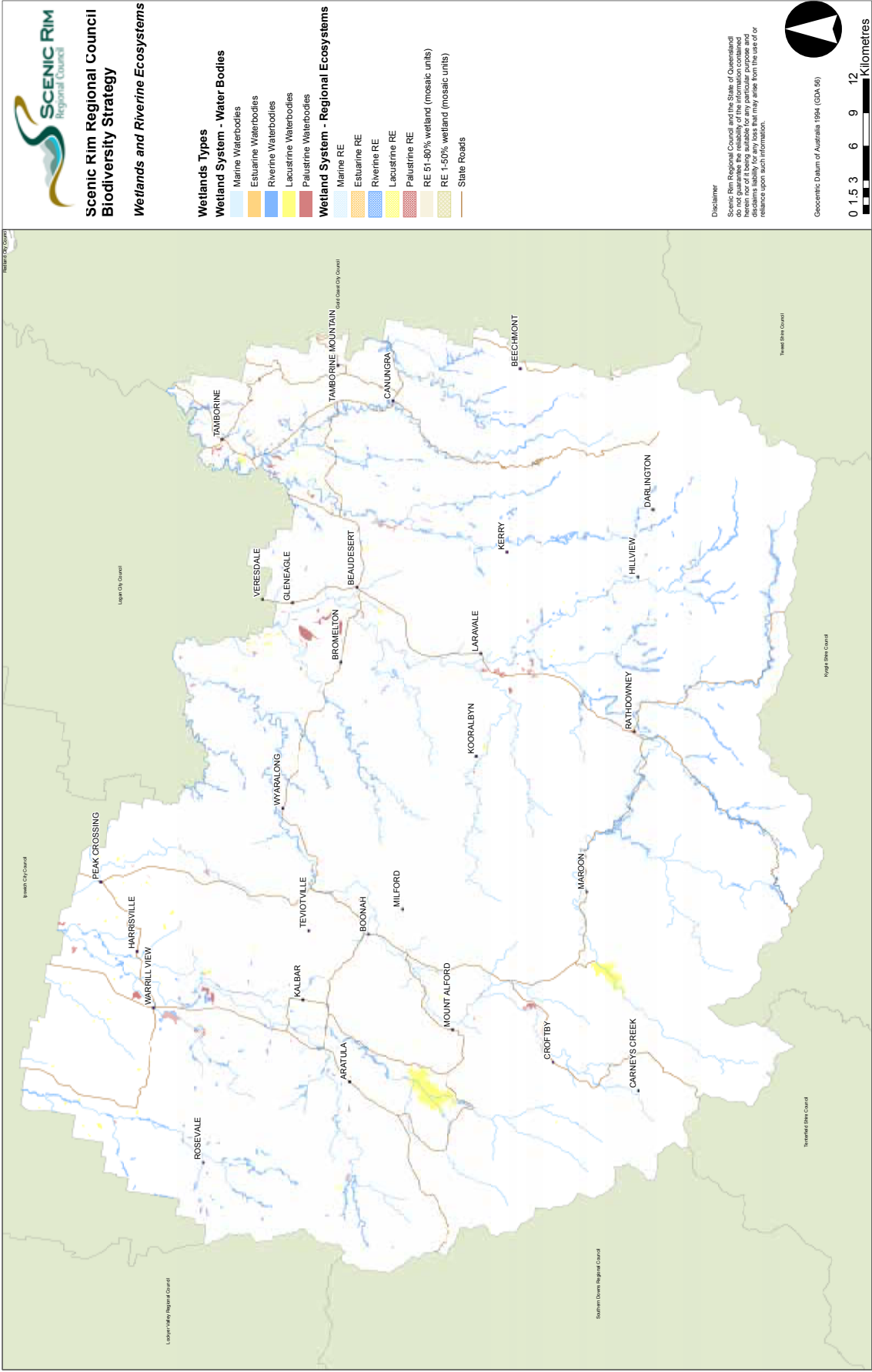

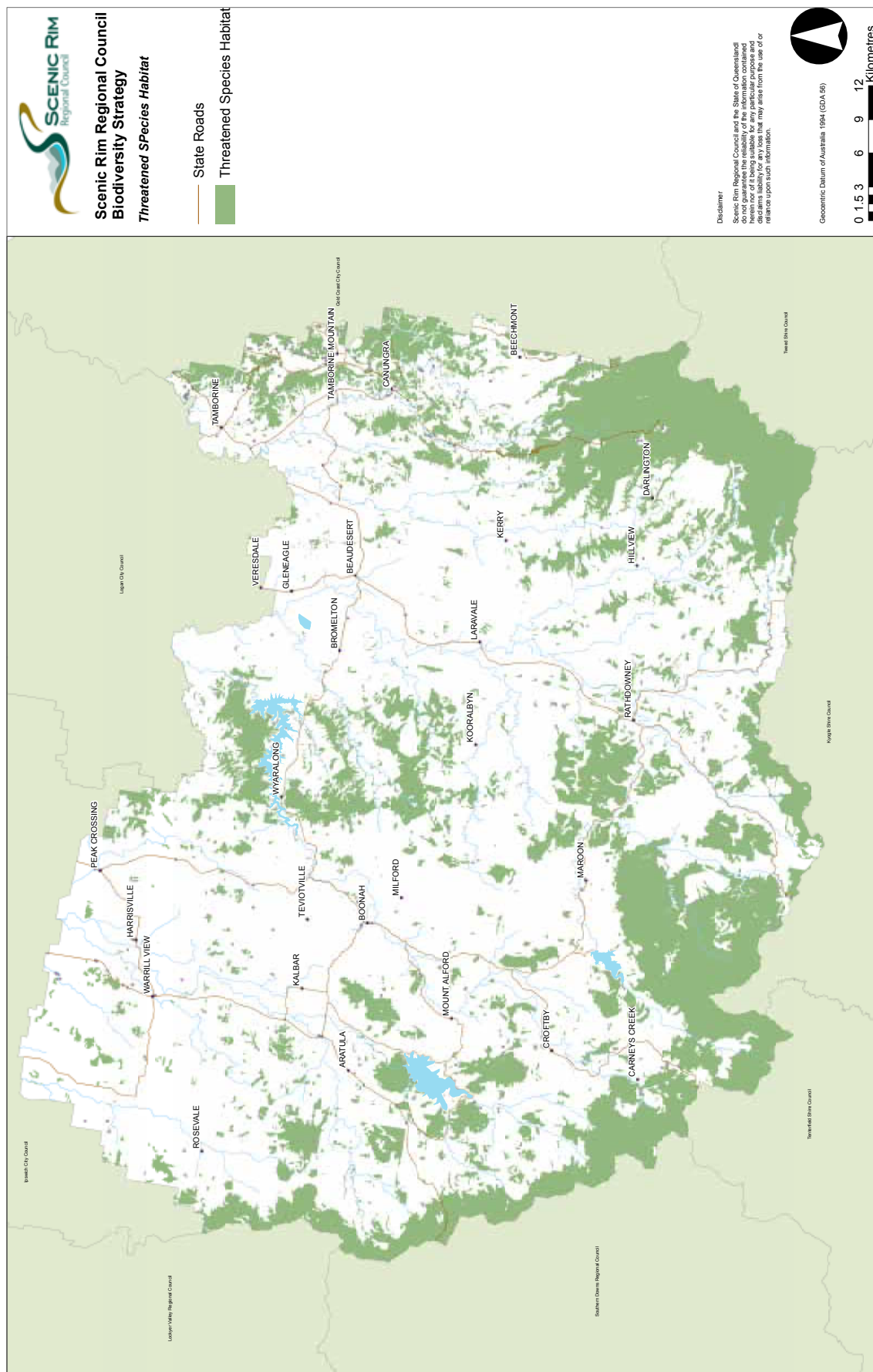

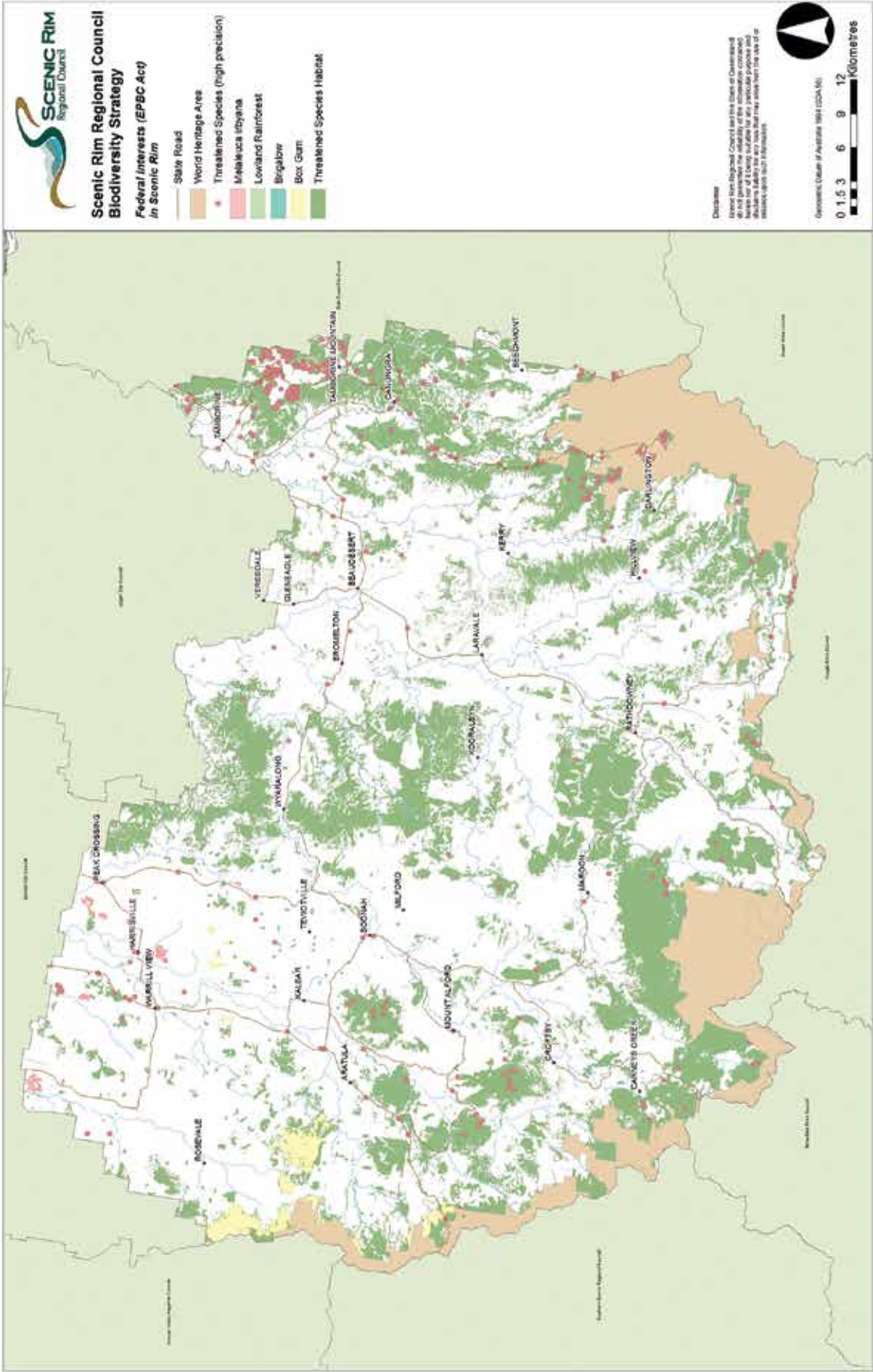
MAP 7: WETLANDS AND RIVERINE ECOSYSTEMS SCENIC RIM
