Gallery Walk Car Park, new raised pedestrian crossing construction and amenities upgrade

As part of Council's ongoing commitment to deliver projects that invest in new infrastructure and essential services for community, construction of Stage One has begun with a new off-road car park to ease traffic congestion on Gallery Walk. This project is jointly funded by the Queensland Government's South East Queensland Community Stimulus Program and Scenic Rim Regional Council.

The next step for Stage One of the project includes approximately 100 metres of upgrades to Long Road, including entry and exit to the car park, a new raised pedestrian crossing, which includes street lighting to enhance pedestrian safety. Public toilet treatment system will also be upgraded.

In addition, a range of safety and amenity enhancements will be delivered, including new landscaping, 1.8-metre fencing around the car park boundary, installation of car park lighting to provide safe visibility for all users, and improved signage to highlight the precinct's unique identity.

When will it happen?

Works will commence in August 2026 and are expected to be completed by December 2026, weather and construction conditions permitting. Works will generally occur between 6:00am and 6:00pm, Monday to Friday, with the exception of Saturday and night works when required.

Where will it happen?

The construction works will take place on Long Road, approximately 100 metres adjacent to 128A Long Road, Tamborine Mountain. Please refer to the map on the next page for the location of the work area.

What can I expect?

Residents and business owners will experience temporary traffic management including temporary lane closures for the duration of the project along Long Road. Variable messaging signs, road signage and traffic controllers will be in place to provide updates and ensure safety throughout the project duration.

Access to some properties will be maintained with the exception of short-term closures for the construction of driveways where required. Given the nature of planned construction activities, the work area will be closed during work hours to allow construction crews to undertake works safely. An active construction zone will be in place in the area, and there will be noise and vibration during works. Water trucks will also be used throughout the project to help manage and reduce dust.

Access to all footpaths will be restricted; however, pedestrian detours will be in place to ensure safe movement around the works. We ask pedestrians to follow the signage accordingly. Safety measures will be implemented to assist safe movements around the construction site.

The Long Road public toilets will remain open and accessible for the full duration of the project. Construction plant and personnel will be active in these areas during construction working hours.

We remind all motorists to follow signage, adhere to reduced speed limits, and take extra care when travelling through the road work zone to ensure the safety of workers and road users.

Every effort will be made to reduce noise and minimise the impact of construction activities on the community. Thank you for your patience and understanding as these important works progress. Council remains committed to keeping the community informed throughout the project, and we encourage everyone to continue supporting local businesses during this time.
